

NBC Greyhounds Bow To Cardinals In Second Loss

COLUMBUS -- The Greyhounds of Northern Burlington suffered their second loss in a row Monday at the hands of a hot-hitting Cardinal team at Lawrence. The Cardinals exploded in the second and fourth innings in a 16-0 victory over Northern. The Greyhounds helped in the defeat with nine errors, three of which gave up runs.

John Parker, pitching in his second game, was pounded with nine hits, giving up nine earned runs. He was relieved with one out in the fourth by Ray Walder.

The Cardinals' bats continued to bring the runners around as Walder gave up three hits and four earned runs. Kirk Louderback pitched his second victory with a shut out, giving up only five hits.

Lawrence put men on base in every inning. In the first a double and an error left men on second and third. In the second inning the Cardinals erupted for seven runs. Tom Maple led off with a single but was forced out at second on a bunt by Don Kiernan. Parker walked the next three batters scoring Kiernan.

Suicide Squeeze

With bases loaded, Mike Corroll executed a suicide squeeze in which third baseman Bill Gorman had trouble picking up the ball and the run scored. A sacrifice fly allowed a run to score and on an error by first baseman John Valachvic the runners advanced. A double by Tom Morinee scored two more runs and a triple by Paul O'Neil scored Morinee. An error by shortstop Arty Calix allowed O'Neil across to complete the scoring.

The Cardinals scored again in the third when a hit by Corroll sent Dave Janeczek across. In the fourth, Morinee walked, O'Neil and Maple both get singles. On a pick-off attempt at second, Calix let the ball by and Morinee scored.

A triple by pinch-hitter Russo scored O'Neil and Maple and Louderback hit Russo in. Janeczek got on base on a throwing error by Gorman. A triple by Drew Kapur scored the final two runs of the inning.

Lawrence scored two more in the fifth. O'Neil and Maple were walked. Kiernan brought them around with a triple.

Greyhounds Threaten

The Greyhounds threatened in the second, third and fourth with runners reaching third in all three innings.

In the second Paul Tootel hit a double and Greg Richardson moved him to third with a single. In a rundown with Richardson between first and second, Tootel tried to score but was tagged out.

In the third Ronny Asson walked and was put on third by a Valachvic double. In the fourth, Tootel reached first on a single and moved to second on a walk and third on a fielder's choice.

Valachvic and Tootel led in hitting for the Greyhounds. Valachvic hit a double, single, and sacrifice bunt. Tootel reached base each time with a double, single, and a walk.

In the Greyhound's fourth, Taylor walked and stole second. He moved to third on a passed ball. Donny Tootel hit him in with a single just out of the reach of second baseman Mike Stewart.

Northern scored the winning run in the fifth. Ronny Asson led off with a single and stole second. He moved to third on a ground ball to the pitcher. Paul Tootel walked and stole second. Mooney then walked Taylor intentionally. With bases loaded, Greg Richardson walked to score Asson.

M.K.S.D. came out of the game with a 1-6 record. Northern's record now stands at 2-3-1. Mon-

day's victory followed a defeat to Pemberton Township Saturday, 4-3 in 8 innings. and bad breaks were the loss.
